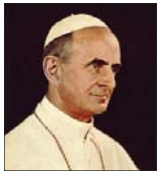

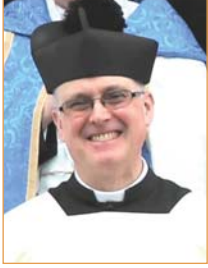

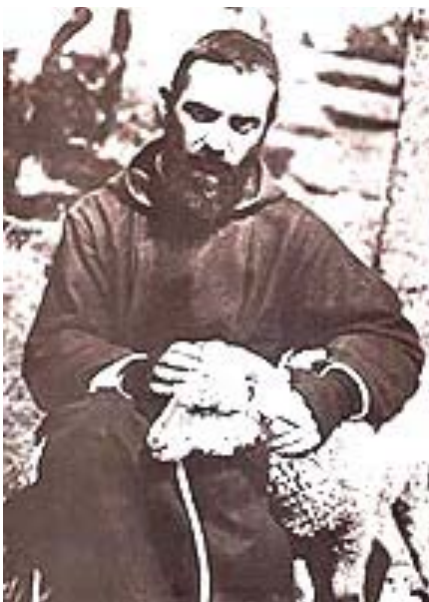
Pastor's Note



THE EMBER DAYS OF SEPTEMBER

Following Holy Cross Day on September 14th, we observe the three Ember Days of September which sanctify the coming autumn season. In them we find traces of our Jewish origins as they evoke much of the spirit contained in the Jewish High Holy Days which begin with Rosh Hashana and include the Day of Atonement, Yom Kippur. This year our autumn embertide begins on Wednesday, September 21st, which is also the Feast of St. Matthew, Apostle and Evangelist. On Ember Friday, September 23rd, we are joined to the feast of St. Padre Pio of Pietrelcina, who bore the stigmata for half-a-century. Then, on Ember Saturday, September 24th, we coincide with the feast of Our Lady of Ransom (also know as Our Lady of Mercy). Special days of grace lie ahead for us this week. Let us enter into them with the prayer of thanksgiving, petition and penance.

EPISTLE: From the Letter of Blessed Paul the Apostle to the Galatians, 5. 25-26; 6. 1-10. **BRETHREN:** If we live in the spirit, let us also walk in the spirit. Let us not be made desirous of vainglory, provoking one another, envying one another. Brethren, and if a man be overtaken in any fault, you, who are spiritual, instruct such a one in the spirit of meekness, considering thyself, lest thou also be tempted. Bear ye one another's burdens, and so you shall fulfill the law of Christ. For if any man think himself to be something, whereas he is nothing, he deceiveth himself. But let everyone prove his own work, and so he shall have glory in himself only, and not in another. For every one shall bear his own burden. And let him that is instructed in the word, Communicate to him that instructeth him, in all good things. Be not deceived, God is not mocked; for what things a man shall sow, those also shall he reap. For he that soweth in his flesh, of the flesh also shall reap corruption: but he that soweth in the spirit, of the spirit shall reap life everlasting. And in doing good, let us not fail; for in due time we shall reap, not failing. Therefore, whilst we have time, let us work good to all men, but especially to those who are of the household of the faith.
